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## 1. COURSE GOAL(s)

The purpose of mastering the discipline **Russian (foreign) language** is the acquisition of knowledge, skills and experience in the field of communication in the Russian-speaking language environment, characterizing the stages of the formation of competencies and ensuring the achievement of the planned results of mastering the educational program.

The main **objectives** of the discipline are:
