1. GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE DISCIPLINE

The aim of mastering the discipline "**Russian as a foreign language**" is the development and improvement of professional and communicative competence of foreign students, including as major components of linguistic, subject, socio-cultural, strategic, compensatory, discursive, speech-behavioral, infocommunicative and other competences, which ensures the effectiveness of educational and professional communication in Russian, willingness and ability to solve professional and communicative tasks using the language studied.
