The course Basics of Lexicography is designed to introduce students to methodological base of Lexicography. Dictionary research will also be exposed. Students should master general problems of Lexicology and its Methods.

- to study basic of principles of dictionary production;
- to study words corpus and databases of different types;
- to analyze tools and methods of developing corpus, database.
