### 1. Purpose and objectives of the discipline:

The purpose of the discipline is to form among graduate students a comprehensive view of historical science as an important factor in the life of modern society, its state and development at the beginning of the XXI century, the main scientific areas of modern humanitarian knowledge, the place and role of universal history in them. The goal, which implies a substantial deepening of knowledge about topical issues of universal history and a clear understanding of the debatable issues of foreign and domestic historiography, determines the specifics of the setting of learning objectives.

## Objectives of the discipline.

- ➤ to highlight the most important priority areas of research on universal history, to acquaint you with the latest concepts in research of various periods of the world-historical process;
- > to show the range of scientific schools, main authors, the most significant works, current trends in the research of topical key problems of universal history;
- ➤ to consider current problems in the history of the Middle East, Africa, Latin America, and Europe;
- ➤ to analyse the work of a number of the largest Western and Russian scientists specialists in the field of modern history and oriental studies;
- > to acquaint with the source studies achievements of modern historical science;
- ➤ to deepen the understanding of modern approaches to the search for cause-andeffect relationships in history;
- > to motivate interest in observing, analysing and discussing current problems of historical science;
- to stimulate independent analytical work of graduate students.

#### 2. Place of discipline in the structure of basic educational program:

The discipline «Actual problems of World History» is included in the Variable Part of the Educational Disciplines as an Elective course (Π.1.Β.05).

One of the urgent problems of modern methods of teaching students and graduate students is the orientation of the whole educational process towards the active independent work of students, the creation of conditions for their self-expression and self-development.

The goal of independent work is to develop the ability to self-study and improve the professional level of a graduate student.

When mastering the discipline, combinations of types of educational work with methods and forms of activating the cognitive activity of graduate students are used to achieve learning outcomes and the formation of competencies. It is assumed that graduate students should independently study the theoretical material of the discipline using Internet resources: search engines, information databases, methodological developments, special educational and scientific literature. The independent work of a graduate student, aimed at deepening and consolidating knowledge, as well as the development of practical skills, involves:

- The work of graduate students with historical and methodological material, search and analysis of printed literature and electronic sources of information on a given problem, including in preparation for classes;
  - homework with the involvement of materials from thematic information resources;
  - the study of theoretical material to prepare for current and intermediate certification.

#### Forms of independent work of students

The independent work of a graduate student on the instructions of the teacher is carried out in extracurricular time, includes the search for textbooks on the subject of studies and tasks, drawing up a list of relevant literature in the specialty, according to the established rules; writing a review of the reading literature on the topic of dissertation research. It is assumed that to ensure visibility and improve the quality of presentation of the material, the content of the work will include the preparation of the Power point presentation (separate assessment). The current control is carried out weekly through the evaluation of oral responses at the seminars, their completeness and consistency.

One of the forms of independent work of graduate students is to prepare a manuscript of the report for the conference. The topic of the report is determined by the graduate student independently, on the basis of the object or subject of his own research, or from a related subject matter. In this case, the final version is agreed in consultation with the teacher. The project is

designed for 1 (second) semester. The result is a manuscript of 10 pages. Evaluated work on the final result. Speech and publication of the report are evaluated additionally.

In the course of work on the review-abstract and manuscript of the report, individual consultations with the teacher are provided. Consultations are held in full-time and distance form.

At the next stage of education one of the forms of independent work of graduate students are:

- preparation of a brief methodological analysis of one dissertation work and one monograph. Relevant literature is either selected from the materials included in the bibliographic list of the dissertation, or (in the absence of) similar scientific topics. It is assumed that the work will be accompanied by a Power point presentation (separate assessment);
- preparation of a manuscript of a scientific article. The topic of the article is determined by the graduate student independently, on the basis of the problems of his own dissertation work, or from an adjacent subject that is close in meaning and content. In this case, the final version is agreed in consultation with the teacher. The project is designed for 1 (third) semester. The result is a manuscript of text with a minimum volume of 10 pages. Evaluated work on the final result. Work on the project includes the collection and processing of historical materials. The fact of publication of an article in a periodical is estimated additionally.

The current control is carried out weekly through the evaluation of oral responses at the seminars, their completeness and consistency. In the course of work on the methodological analysis of scientific works and the manuscript of the article, individual consultations with the teacher are provided. Consultations are held in full-time and distance form.

#### 11. Guidelines for organizing the study of the discipline:

The implementation of the course involves practical exercises, group discussions, opposition, modern knowledge control technologies. For the implementation of knowledge assessment and intermediate certification of students used a credit assessment system of knowledge.

Postgraduate students are required: attendance of classes, obligatory participation in certification tests, conferences and round tables, implementation of all tasks of the head of the discipline. The completeness, quality and elaboration of the issue in the process is evaluated:

- work on practical classes (the ability to lead a discussion, a creative approach, the ability to clearly and capaciously formulate your thoughts in writing and orally in the process of a response, report or opposition);
- preparation for independent research and practical activities of a specialist historian;
- performance of tasks, reports, speeches, presentations, written works;
- current and intermediate certification.
