1. COURSE GOALS

The aim of the course is:

- ✓ to examine the issues of the theory of constitutional law, general concepts and categories of science of constitutional law as a system;
- ✓ to get students to master the methodology of legal analysis of the norms of constitutional law and the activities of state bodies and public institutions based on them;
- ✓ to explore the influence of political, economic, societal and cultural, and moral factors on constitutional and legal norms and practice;
- ✓ to examine the variety of options for constitutional and legal regulation and find the most expedient, effective (ideal) model focused on universal values, and clarify the possibilities of its application in certain specific historical conditions;
- ✓ to study constitutions, as well as laws and other regulations that are sources of constitutional law.
