1. OBJECTIVE OF THE DISCIPLINE

Course Aim

This course introduces students to basic concepts of directing through the exploration of principles, techniques and responsibilities of the director from pre-rehearsal, rehearsal planning, script selection, and preparation through the first performance.

The main objectives are

- 1. To equip students with skills in coordinating the practical elements and technical requirements of directing: blocking, scheduling, auditioning, and prompt book analysis.
- 2. To expose students to skills in analysing a script and developing concepts.
- 3. To understand the role of the director as a collaborative individual in articulating and shaping the vision through embracing the creativity of the design team and actors.
