•to show the impact of international migration on the socio-economic and demographic development of countries;

• to reveal the features of the functioning of instruments for regulating international migration (passport systems, visa systems, the institution of citizenship);

•to give an idea regarding the approaches to migration management and the principles of migration policy formation.
