## 1. OBJECTIVE OF THE DISCIPLINE

### Course Aim

The aim of this course is to acquaint the students with an understanding of jobs in the newspaper organisation like editor, news reporter, feature writer, photojournalist, sports writer and activities in it. Students will equally learn basic elements of journalism such as news values, sources and news writing, interview, and journalism ethics.

The main objectives are

1. Students will be acquainted with the leading jobs in the newspaper, the descriptions, and responsibilities
2. Students will be equipped with skills and techniques in newsgathering and news writing
3. Students will learn how editors select and edit news stories, features, and photographs
