1) to enhance students' knowledge of legal regime applicable to international business transactions, including sources of regulation applicable to transactions;

2) to gain in-depth understanding of cross-border commercial contracts, their principal features and principals involved in their drafting and implementation as well as resolution of disputes arising thereof.
