1. OBJECTIVE OF THE DISCIPLINE

Course Aim

The course will equip students with skills to develop sports news, feature writing and broadcasting. It will equally explore media law and regulation in the field of sports journalism and will help students to understand how to seek accreditation for sporting events and report them.

The main objectives are

- 1. To expose students to systems of sports organisations around the world and journalistic practices associated with them.
- 2. Students will learn the role of sports journalism and its institutions, in print, broadcast and electronic media.
- 3. Students will learn journalistic production skills to write, edit, and produce articles for sports organisations.
