1. COURSE GOAL(s)

The main purpose is to introduce students to International Law as one of the professional disciplines necessary for mastering legal translation and interpreting skills. This course offers an introduction to the basic concepts of International Law as well as methods of interpreting analysis of texts relating to the given legal domain. The content of the course is intended to familiarize the students with those concepts and analytical tools they may require for translation practice of relevant legal documents. In addition, it attempts to provide an overview of the field that enables students to seek answers for further questions about administrative law and to start formulating and pursuing their own research interests in legal language domain.
