1. OBJECTIVE OF THE DISCIPLINE

The main goal of this course is to equip students with basic journalism skills in principles and practice and to expose them to the understanding of the journalist's responsibility to society. It will provide a background of the field and take students through the process of journalistic writing in creating good news stories and feature articles; interviewing and research; and editing skills.

The main objectives are

- 1. To equip students with reporting skills: The ability to report in-depth, using a wide variety of sources to provide context, accuracy, and balance.
- 2. To equip students with news writing skills: The ability to produce stories that are clear and concise and engage the audience's attention.
- 3. To expose students to the role and responsibilities of journalists in understanding the roles and duties of journalism in society, and recognition of the ethics of their work through legal and moral implications.
