1. DISCIPLINE (MODULE) GOAL

The goal of mastering the discipline " Comparative Literature (English and Russian Literature)" is to prepare for the candidate's examinations, as well as the development of competences (AC - academic competences, NC - research competences).

The program was devised to prepare highly-qualified professionals in the sphere of scientific research and academic teaching; to develop and enlarge the students' professional abilities in accordance with the state and universal standards, and to equip them with the necessary knowledge and scientific experience and skill for performing the concluding scientific research enriching and expanding the sphere of literary studies.

The main goal of the course "Comparative Literature (English and Russian Literature)" is to acquaint graduate students with the main trends in Russian and English literature in a comparative aspect in particular, using linguistic and discourse analytical method. The similarities and differences with the approaches to other texts will also be exposed.
