1. OBJECTIVE OF THE DISCIPLINE

The course Storytelling aims to develop students' ability to craft compelling narratives across various media formats. It focuses on the principles, structures, and emotional techniques that make stories effective in journalism, marketing, entertainment, and digital communication.

The main objectives are:

1. To introduce students to classical and modern narrative structures used in media storytelling.
2. To develop practical skills in character development, plot construction, and emotional engagement.
3. To explore the use of storytelling in different formats — written, visual, audio, and multimedia.
4. To enhance students' critical awareness of how stories shape perception and influence audiences.
