1. DISCIPLINE (MODULE) GOAL

The purpose of mastering the discipline "Russian as a Foreign Language" is to pass the candidate examination.

2. REQUIREMENTS TO PHD-STUDENTS ON FINISHING THE COURSE

Mastering the discipline "Russian as a Foreign Language" is aimed at preparing for the candidate examinations and developing practical skills in mastering a foreign language in the aspect of scientific, pedagogical and other professional activities of a doctoral student, namely: knowledge of linguistic norms of speech communication culture, norms of the foreign language in the field of oral speech, linguistic characteristics of various types of discourse, rules of speech behavior in conditions of intercultural professional and business communication. The doctoral student must know the vocabulary representing the general scientific style; be able to select linguistic means adequate to the current communicative situation; carry out analytical-synthetic processing of information obtained from oral and written sources; participate in a discussion, analyze, express, argue, participate in discussing a problem, noting its causes, advantages and disadvantages; propose possible solutions through case analysis; understand the main content of specialized texts with the main lexical and grammatical phenomena characteristic of general scientific and professional speech, write abstracts and annotations of information from various sources in writing; master various reading strategies, skills of free monologue and dialogic expression in a given communicative sphere of communication; written speech skills, as well as basic translation skills.
