### 1. COURSE GOALS

The purpose of studying the discipline " International Settlements and Currency Transactions " is to expand the students' knowledge about international monetary and credit relations in the context of globalization of the world economy and about the main problems and prospects for the development of the world monetary and the possibilities of regulating international monetary and credit relations.

### The main objectives of the discipline are:

-To study the stages of development of the world monetary system and the theoretical aspects of the development of financial crises and ways to overcome them;

-To identify the main types of regulation of international currency relations and to identify the reasons for the liberalization of currency regulation in the world

-To trace the changes and trends in the development of the global foreign exchange market

-To study the basics of international settlements and the essence of international credit relations

-To explain the role of central banks and international financial institutions in the regulation of international monetary and credit relations
