1. THE GOAL OF MASTERING THE DISCIPLINE

The course "Jurisprudence" is part of the bachelor's program "Data Science and Space Systems" in the direction 27.03.04 "Control in Technical Systems" and is studied in the 5th semester of the 3rd year. The course is implemented by the Department of Theory of Law and State, the Department of Land and Environmental Law. The course consists of 8 sections and 40 topics and is aimed at studying the main legal concepts and legal structures, the relationships between legal phenomena. Upon completion of the course, students should learn to correlate the theoretical knowledge obtained in studying this course with practical needs. The course creates an opportunity to systematize legal knowledge and form in students a systemic understanding of the state and legal life of society. The content of the course is dictated by the desire to form in students an understanding of the basic concepts of the science of law, the features of mutual influence and interaction of legal phenomena, and to reveal the foundations of the most important legal institutions.

The purpose of mastering the discipline is for students to acquire knowledge in the field of the fundamentals of the theory of state and law, leading branches of the Russian legal system, and the fundamentals of legal regulation of future professional activities.
